
Glenn Fiedler

FUSS TIGNTES Four decorating stars show easy ways to put some twinkle into your home holidays.



Martin Amado's fuss-free plan

Amado is never at a loss for ideas. He submitted several, but the simplest is his idea to make the chandelier above your dining table a focal point. He wrapped a simple berry garland around the base of the arms of the light fixture. (He says you can also give the lamp a festive feel by changing the lampshades to holiday green.) In the background, he attached a pre-lit garland to existing scarf holders, but he says you can also attach tassels or ribbons to the garland and hook them onto a small finish nail on the wall. If you want to dress up the garland, add ribbons, pine cones, ornaments or floral picks.

Vern Yip's fuss-free plan

Don't want to bother with a tree? Make a field of poinsettias your focal point. To create a big statement, purchase them in the same color - all red or all white. Group the plants in front of a fireplace (as we did here) or place them on and around a table in your foyer. Decorate the top of your fireplace with garland interspersed with candles and a few of your favorite ornaments.
